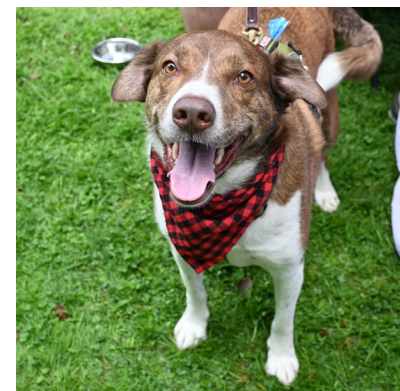

Adult Classes

CERAMICS

Our long-established ceramics department offers classes for the beginner to advanced student. Registered students have the opportunity to develop, grow, and enjoy optional open studio time. Advanced students may also take part in BAYarts Annual Advanced Student Ceramic Exhibit in the spring. Participants will learn how to market, sell, display and install an exhibit. Classes include clay, glazes and firing. *Fees apply for extra clay.

Beginning Ceramics • \$360 • Daloz

For students with little to no experience. Perhaps you have never taken a ceramics class, or you have but you want a refresher course. In this class we will learn the basics of wheel thrown and hand built ceramics, from wedging to glazing. Let us help you start on your clay journey! Classroom is wheelchair accessible.

Beginner To Advanced Ceramics • \$360 • Daloz

A class for students at all skill levels. Whether you're looking to perfect an already growing skill set, try working with clay for the first time, or unsure where you stand, this class is for you. Join us as we all find new ways to approach and improve techniques in both hand built and wheel thrown ceramics. Classroom is wheelchair accessible.

Exploring Form • \$360 • Serafino

Students will explore various building techniques to explore form, altering form, stacking forms and combining techniques to create new and interesting shapes in clay. Some assignments will be given.

Independent Study • \$360 • Beale

Beginning students will learn the basics in hand building and get a taste of throwing pieces such as mugs, bowls and platters plus glaze demos. Intermediate to advanced students will have the opportunity to refine their skills and work on independent projects plus instructors will give suggestions on form and style development. Individual projects will be given as needed based on level and skill. Focus this session will be on surface design, brushwork and glazing. All students will receive one-on-one attention and consultation. Classroom is wheelchair accessible.

Journey In Clay – All Levels • \$360 • Beale

Pottery is an exciting and mysterious craft, whether you imagine yourself on the potter's wheel or creating hand built objects, we offer you everything you need to embark on a journey exploring the endless possibilities in ceramics. For beginners, we will offer a range of assignments in the basics of hand building and a taste of throwing together with glaze demos. More experienced students will have the opportunity to improve skills and create both artistic and functional forms with instructor guidance. Classroom is wheelchair accessible.

Join celebrated Irish artist Hugh O'Neill from Ireland Art Tours and discover your creative potential. This immersive 2-day workshop will provide a supportive and inspiring environment where artists can explore acrylic and oil techniques, fostering creativity and self-expression. Live models are essential and will be present throughout the course. Open to all levels, yet some experience is helpful. A supply list will be provided prior to class. Using acrylics and/or oil, learn the fundamentals of painting, from organizing a palette and blending, color mixing, brushwork, and glazing techniques to the elements of design and composition. All levels are welcome, especially beginning painters! Supply list will be provided prior to class. Class is located on the second floor.

Beginning Oil Painting • \$432 • Hajnaj

This course is designed for students who are beginners and interested in learning how to paint in oils. You will learn about different types of mediums, brushes, and different grades of paints. We will practice together in class by painting still lifes, landscapes, portraits of people and pets. You will learn different techniques from the Renaissance and Baroque eras. The main objective of this class is to become comfortable and familiar with painting in oil, and also have lots of fun while learning.

Wednesday • 5–8 pm • June 11–August 13

Intermediate/Advanced Oil Painting • \$432 • Hajnaj

Learn how to paint like the Old Masters. This course is designed for students who are interested in learning different painting techniques from the Renaissance and Baroque eras. You will also learn chiaroscuro, as seen in works by Da Vinci, Caravaggio, and Rembrandt. The main objective of this class is to have fun and learn.

* Paint BAYarts: Practice Plein Air Workshop • \$65 • Tulcewicz

Have you always wanted to be that artist that is out in the park painting, soaking in the calmness of the day while producing an original piece of art? Are you hesitant to enter a formal plein air contest and would like to learn what it takes?

Come to the workshop geared with your favorite painting medium (watercolors, acrylics, oils or pastels) and supplies to paint a scene outdoors on the BAYarts campus.

First we will have a discussion, assess materials and then head outside for some sketches before returning for a friendly critique of composition choices. We will then travel out to paint. You will break and lunch on your own. The day will end with a group discussion and friendly critiques. Bring along a lunch. Intermediate level.

Do you want to improve your drawing skills? Good sketches lead to good drawings! All you need are a couple of pencils, an eraser, and a sketchbook.

Here's how we'll do it: We'll gather as a friendly group and I will introduce you to a few sketching exercises in graphite pencil. Then we'll disperse and wander the BAYarts campus where you will sketch the next assignment. Next, we'll come back together to discuss and share your results. After that comes round #2! You'll get another assignment, and head off for more sketching, followed by more discussion and sharing. Finally, round #3 and wrap up with some quick sketches.

It will be a mindful, meaningful, and relaxing day, in which you will build your sketching and drawing skills. This class is for all levels.

In this course, students will learn and practice the underpinning concepts of constructing oil paintings, including blocking-in with dead color, relating values and exploring color theory. We will explore the properties of oil paints, how to mix colors, and how to create texture and depth in their work in service of compelling compositions. By the end of the course, students will have developed a solid foundation in oil painting, with the skills to create their own expressive pieces.

Also known as gothicised italic, this is a softer, more modern form of blackletter. This style can be used to create beautiful art pieces and can be used alone or mixed well with other calligraphy styles and is a great introduction to broad nib calligraphy. Students will learn how to use a Pilot Parallel pen learning the basic calligraphy strokes, embellishments, and spacing as well as pen manipulation and use in ornamental design.

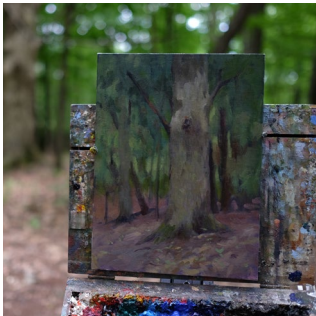
